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TRUST

We instinctively trust those whose personalities are founded upon correct principles. Technique is relatively unimportant when compared to trust, which is the fruit of our trustworthiness over time. When trust is high, we communicate easily, effortlessly, instantaneously. Though we err, others still capture our meaning. When trust is low, communications are exhausting, time-consuming ineffective, and inordinately difficult. Success on any plane of life, depends on trust - trust extended from ourselves to others as well as trust extended from others to us. When trust is betrayed, tendencies are to vow never to trust the betraying party again, or to "wait" until trust is re-earned. This can present quite a paradox. If trust results in trustworthiness over time, and we have vowed to not trust, then the offending brother or sister never has the opportunity to prove their trustworthiness, even in the smallest matters.

While studying trust, clarity comes easier when we reference the pattern of our Lord. We must wholeheartedly agree upon his trustworthiness. When tried, he invariably proves trustworthy. With another was entrusted the virtual pastorate of His infant church and, on the eve of the crucifixion, would, out of his love for the Lord, physically challenge the decree of Roman power. The same friend, however, would lose his resolve and even curse the very Son of God before next break of day. With what agonizing feelings of betrayal would we have viewed such a response from our friends? And how natural the thought, "How could I have trusted them in the first place?".

Being Lord, He knew beforehand their fleshly weakness. He warned of their lack of trustworthiness that would show in time of trial, though

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

"We die daily," said the apostle. This was literally the life of the early Christian; wherever they journeyed, their lives were in constant jeopardy. We are not this day called to pass through the same fearful persecutions: if we were, the Lord would give us grace to bear the test; but the tests of Christian life, at the present moment, though outwardly not so terrible, are yet more likely to overcome us than even those of that fiery age.

We have to bear the sneer of the world. That is little; its blandishments, its soft words, its oily speeches, its fawning, its hypocrisy, are far worse. Our danger is lest we grow rich and become proud, lest we give ourselves up to the fashions of this present evil world, and lose our faith. Or if wealth be not the trial, worldly cared is quite as mischievous.

Whether we are torn to pieces by the lion, or hugged to death by the bear, the devil little cares which it is, so long as he destroys our love to Christ, and our confidence in him. I fear that the Christian church is far more likely to lose her integrity in these soft and silken days than in those rougher times.

Many in these days of easy profession are likely to prove tares, and not wheat; hypocrites with fair masks on their faces, but not the true-born children of the living God. Christian, do not think that these are times in which you can dispense with watchfulness or with holy ardour; you need these things more than ever, and may God the eternal Spirit display his omnipotence in you, that you may be able to say, in all these softer things, as well as in the rougher, "We are more that conquerors through him that loved us."

they just 'knew' such would never occur. "Not me, Lord. My love for you is too deep and our ties too strong for me to deny or forsake you.", was the essence of their argument. From this scene of the "last supper" they soon departed into the night, as Jesus made His way to the Garden of Gethsemane. While awaited by "friends", He communed with the Father one final before meeting the destiny for which He came. No sooner had His prayer concluded than appeared His captors, and the "friends", who had considered themselves trustworthy, would soon vanish. All night He would spend - shackled and forsaken, without witness of His innocence and with no thought of escaping the death He knew was eminent. At midmorning next day, He was taken to Golgotha, where, though the very Son of God, he hang as a public spectacle, between the heavens and earth for the sins of even His closest friends. Before dark, He would be dead — taken from this dreadful scene and laid in a tomb donated by a sympathizer. Still little sign of those from whom He had received the assurance, "You can trust me, Lord."

(Reference John 21:1-17) Three days and three nights would pass as his trusted friends surely agonized over how it had all ended — or so they thought. Simon Peter, whom three days before had felt totally invincible, had bitterly repented of his infidelity. Can we doubt his desire for one more opportunity to be trusted by his Lord? All appeared lost. His Lord was dead. Three times he had denied the very One from whom he had witnessed those countless miracles. On Peter's conscience must have weighed the thought of having actually cursed the Son of God. Can we doubt the anguish under which the apostle labored as he reminisced the exhilarating experience on the Mount of Transfiguration, along with others which hang profoundly heavy in his memory? Depression and despondency surely settled progressively heavier on the heart of Simon Peter, as thoughts of his failures were gradually erasing hope of ever again enjoying fellowship with the One at whose feet he yearned to sit once more. However, Peter was learning a lesson, one that would serve all of us well — that THIS SIDE OF DEATH, THERE IS HOPE FOR ONE WITH A TRULY PENITENT SPIRIT! Peter would go fishing, convinced he had forfeited his fondest hope of advancing his Savior's cause. Tired from laboring through the night, little must Peter have expected as the morning broke — suddenly, there He was on the shore! Startled, he turned to his partner John, only to hear John exclaim, "It's the Lord!". Though this is probably his third encounter with the Savior since the resurrection, for the first time, Peter is visibly touched with His presence.

Excited & apparently with a feeling of appearing immodest, he quickly replaces the clothing removed under conditions which he thought no one would notice, and without attention to either those around him or to the great catch of fish, into the sea he thrusts himself, excitedly thrashing his way toward his Lord on the shore. This was obviously the first time Peter realized that Jesus had forever removed the cloud of his humiliating denial. Over the seaside morning meal, making sure that Peter understood the commitment he was about to consummate, Jesus asked, "Do you love me?". Three times the same question was asked with like answers, (paraphrased) "Lord, though I am guilty of atrocious sins, you know my repentance is whole and that I am truly ready to go with you all the way.".

At this point, Peter's life changes, for now he realizes that Jesus is as anxious to forgive the saint as He is to set free the sinner. From this experience of restoration, Peter ceased to be a fisherman and became the evangelist he was destined to become. Only now was Peter really committed. For only now did he understand this dimension of love that Jesus harbors for his own – that he is anxious to forgive upon full repentance -- and to extend opportunity to rebuild trust within His kingdom. Could our experience as His servant be richer if we considered His example?

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earth. Their attitude exemplified the one integral of the human heart that will plague our lifelong fellowship with Jesus, unless we continually inspect for its presence. The Pharisees and Saducees just could not understand Jesus -- how one claiming to be the Messiah could actually sit and eat with publicans and sinners, dregs of their society. What these honest, upright, and sincere religious leaders could not recognize was that within their hearts lay the ugly, decadent seed of 'prejudice'.

"Prejudice" is "an opinion formed without taking time and care to judge fairly; an opinion formed beforehand with no basis except personal feelings". The heart and mind of Jesus was void of such tendencies. The soul of the despised publican drew as much of Jesus interest as did that of the popular, well-respected scribe. John the Baptist refused baptism to some Pharisees without evidence of their hearts and minds having been purged of their previously prevailing prejudice. Only a genuine washing by the Holy Spirit rids one of this perilous brand of pride called 'prejudice'! Those half-breeds called Samaritans were despised simply because of their heritage wrought centuries before. The Apostle Peter lived to be an old man before ridding himself of the prejudicial notion that just because he was of a certain ethnic group, he had a more direct line to Heaven. What was the mistake of the Pharisees? Their opinions of the publicans were formed before taking time to judge them as Jesus saw them. Their opinions of Jesus -- his eating with known sinners -- were formed beforehand with no basis except personal feelings. For from this pool of publicans, Jesus would choose one to record a detailed account of his life on earth-- the Gospel of Matthew.

What was the mistake of the Jews toward the Samaritans? They judged them unfairly --solely on the basis of their lineage. Likewise, the mistake of Peter, the one that cost him a lecture from Paul, was that he judged all others but Jews as inferior to himself. Gentiles were unfit to eat with, talk with, work with, or even preach to.

Until we can view another as Jesus sees him, prejudice will plague our spiritual growth. How is our fellowship with God fettered with 'prejudice'? Hopefully, the following examples will awaken our awareness to prejudice in our own lives.

How do we view one of another vocation--one whom the world, or even ourselves, may view as less honorable than that of ours? What attitude prevails as we encounter a laborer at what we consider menial tasks? As we cruise by in our dress clothes and air-conditioned vehicle, do we ever-so-secretly entertain an attitude of superiority -- of being smarter, richer, more intelligent, or even having been more favored by God? Do we see him as less deserving than ourselves? Or does piety flow within our hearts as we realize that within his chest is harbored a desire for peace within, just like ourselves; a desire to earn better times for himself and his family? Moreover, does it cross our minds that God may be at least as interested in the concerns of that person's heart as he is with ours? For neither position.power, nor esteem of men elevate us in the sight of God. Remember, elements that sway our judgment do not necessarily impress God at all!

How do we view one of less means than ourselves, even if he is

less diligent by habit? "He could have something too, if he had been willing to work for it.", is a statement we may have heard -- or used, either silently or orally. Such an attitude is born of prejudice! But what if certain 'breaks' had not come our way in life? What if, subconsciously, we have come to the point of reverencing our means more than we ought? Is our prosperity due more to our own ingenuity, or has God given us more that we may return more to him?

How do we view one of another shade of skin color? Much can be determined about one's Christian authenticity by listening to feelings expressed on this one subject. Possibly because skin color is the most obvious of our attributes, this may be the most conducive to prejudice. Atrocious statements revealing blatant prejudicial feelings are often drawn when such topics are mentioned. Comparing different races worshipping together to mixing cows and horses, reminiscing about neighbors of different color visting 'white' services and sitting in the back 'out of respect', boasting of relatives being members of the KKK and 'proud of it' is to admit un-Godly prejudice, regardless of stature in life. (Note: I have personally witnessed these particular statements -- inside church studies or services.) Again, how would Jesus judge such positions of prejudice? Thank God, we don't have to wait until it's too late to know!

How do we view one of another ethnic group? "Those ______, you can't trust any of them." How would we have fared if Jesus had said, "Those Gentiles, you can't trust any of them."? Need more be said? What do we view as the most atrocious sins? Are they not invariably the ones we do not commit? Examples: 1) How can we be so outraged at the partaking of alcoholic beverages (which of course is foolish) while being forty pounds overweight as a result of gluttony? 2) How can we so adamantly oppose thievery while carrying a lottery ticket, hoping to become richer without work, and at someone else's expense? 3) How can one ridicule adultery in others while being entertained with TV drama depicting the same acts? (If the scenes were not enjoyed, they wouldn't be watched.)

4) How can we find fraud so repulsive, while denying God the tithe? WHY? When prejudice fills our hearts, the sins of others are always greater our own.

The Pharisees were morally pure, but had omitted the "weightier matters of the law" -- judgment (opposite of prejudice), mercy, and faith. Matt.23;23 Being void of prejudice, Jesus could see potential for glory in every one he met. He considered the rich and poor alike, Jews and Gentiles without prejudice, and he expects us to do the same. IF JESUS MADE NO DIFFERENCE, THERE IS NO DIFFERENCE, REGARDLESS OF OUR 'FEELINGS' OR TRADITIONS. In the eyes of God neither our level of wealth, social standing, skin color, or ethnic heritage is of consequence. What really matters is what we have done with Jesus and our diligence in learning--and practicing- his ways. All else eventually becomes insignificant!!!
